I love cats!

Here are a few hints to keep the registration process efficient for both teachers and administrators:

- 1. Limit **time requests** and keep time request notes short.
- 2. Carpool requests need only student name(s) and level(s) in the Carpools box.
- 3. Special Needs box is for students with learning challenges or disabilities a Site Administrator needs to be aware of.
- 4. Contact a Site Administrator to ask what volunteer opportunities are available.
- 5. **Double-check** information with students/parents before submitting registrations, especially theory requirements.

<u>Proposal submissions</u> are due no later than December 15th. The selection committee will meet in January at which time submissions will be reviewed and chosen to be a part of the convention.






MusicLink News

Independent Music Teachers Forum - How Can You Grow as a Teacher This Year? Jenna Huntoon, Chair



Fall is such an energizing time of year. Parents and students excitedly prepare with new school supplies, looking forward to the school year ahead and the possibilities that are to come. As an independent music teacher, I thrive on that energy as I prepare my studio for the new school year. Not only do I work with my students to set goals in the fall, but it is the perfect time to set professional goals as well. How can you grow as a teacher this year?

At the studio level, perhaps you can add, or expand on your teaching of composing or music history, explore repertoire that is new to you, add quarterly group lessons or a studio wide challenge to inspire your students. Maybe you are ready to put students into an area event that you've never tried before, or increase the number of

students that you have in events. Yes, these things take time and planning, but there are many resources available to help, including your fellow teachers!

There are many opportunities to get involved at the local level. Try volunteering for an event you've never been involved in before, serve on your local association board, or become involved in other local music events or groups outside of MMTA to meet other music-minded people. Be an advocate for music in your community. Trying something new is a great way to grow professionally. You will likely meet new people and expand your relationships with colleagues you already know.

At the state level, volunteers are always needed and appreciated! Perhaps you can volunteer some time at the MMTA office. Learning what goes on "behind the scenes" gives you a unique perspective. Getting hands-on experience with various MMTA events is such a great way to learn about the events, improve your teaching, and meet new colleagues. Those connections are especially important for independent music teachers who spend a lot of time alone professionally.

MTNA offers amazing webinars: you can learn from and connect with other teachers around the country without leaving your house! Or, if you are ready to get out of the house, the national conference is scheduled in Reno, Nevada, March 25 - 29, 2023.

The new school year is a great time for setting new goals and challenging yourself to be an even better teacher. In return you will benefit by being rejuvenated, expanding your knowledge, making connections with new colleagues, and growing as a teacher. MMTA Board Minutes Highlights—June 2022

 The Board voted to accept the contract with Artusi to create custom online theory exams that will match the current MMTA Theory curriculum. The membership will be informed when the exams will begin to be used. The online exams will replace part of the current virtual exams.

MMTA Board Minutes Highlights—July 2022

- The Board voted to purchase a new laptop for use by Site Administrators and other personnel for MMTA events.
- Beginning 2022-2023, the Handbook will now be online only.
 Members may request a paper copy but only if needed. This will be a significant savings.

MMTA Board Minutes Highlights—August 2022

- The Board approved a revised shipping fee chart that was adjusted to address the rising cost of postage.
- A limit of \$1000 was approved for the Board retreat in September.

MMTA Board Minutes Highlights—September 2022

- After Kris Olson was voted onto the Board for VP Convention, she announced that Dr. Leah Claiborne will be the 2023 MMTA Convention Keynote Speaker.
- Revisions were made to Site Administrator pay.
- President-Elect Laura Harding reported on discussions held at the Leadership Summit in Ohio at MTNA HQ. There are efforts being made to increase collegiate membership. MTNA is also moving forward by adding a VP-Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion position to their Board of Directors. Discussions took place about doing the same for MMTA.
